# Ringing for Notre Dame 18th April



We rang each bell up individually from treble (high) to tenor (low) to signify the burning down of the spire. We then rang rounds. Then we rang down individually from tenor to treble to signify the rebuilding. Treble then tolled for a few minutes. 9 of our ringers wanted to feel part of this so the way we did it enabled them all to be part of it. Also there was a service at 7 so we couldn't ring then and needed all bells down.

## Project Launch

#### 26th April

On 26<sup>th</sup>April we launched our Bell Restoration Project to keep our bells ringing for the next generation and beyond. 48 visitors came to hear what we are planning on doing with the bells and how they could join us in this exciting project. Tower Captain Debbie Phipps gave a presentation explaining a bit about the growth of their current band, what is to be done with the bells, the costs involved and future events to help raise funds.





We were delighted to have the Wimborne handbell group to give a demonstration of change ringing and we thank Alan Bentley for organising this. Jack Pease organised our band of ringers to ring both before and after the presentation and we were joined by some of our friends from East Dorset.

Simon from Taylor's came down from Loughborough and brought some bell

parts similar to the ones which will be replaced in our tower which were much talked about and even formed part of our vicar Stephen's sermon the following morning. All took cover as Stephen picked up an extremely large, heaver clapper to talk about.

Following the presentation our visitors mingled and enjoyed refreshments and bell shaped



biscuits. We had a display of books which one nonringer browsed and found references to a great-relative from late 19th century who was quite eminent in his time. There was a live video feed set up by Alan from the bell chamber onto a large screen so we could see 2 of the bells as they were ringing. This was much appreciated by a lot of the attendees. There was also a model bell for demonstration.

Though this was not a fundraising event our visitors were kind enough to make donations to the sum of £432 towards the cost of our Bell Restoration Project.

We are now in a position to place our order by using some Trust Fund but we will continue to apply for Grants and have Fundraising events in order to retain a sum in the Trust Fund for future expenses.

After the Big Clean in September we moved on to the next stage when 24 willing volunteers cleaned, painted, restored and made refreshments so that the Bell Tower and frame

were completely prepared for the bells to be rehung. We rubbed down the frame ready to use Fertan on any rust. When dry this was

rubbed off ready for the undercoat. The undercoat was a rusty colour and the tower was soon looking very smart. But we began to think it might look better if we painted the walls as well thus making our job much longer but greatly satisfying. The top coat was an ivory Rustoleum and we gave the frame 2 coats of this. The walls had 2 coats of limewash paint.

During this time we found 4 cracks in the frame which were quickly dealt with by Taylor's in early November so we could keep to the time frame to have our bells ringing for Christmas.

## Foundry Visit J Taylor & Co - Loughborough

30th October 2019

A great day was had by some of our bellringers, church members and friends on Wednesday visiting our bells at Loughborough. We just had to make careful inspection as to what was being done.



34 ringers and from Dorset and other friends made the long journey up to Loughborough to visit the Bell Foundry where are bells are currently being refurbished. As one of our ringers commented "it was like going back in time".

Sadly we couldn't see the foundry itself but we were able to learn how the tuning works and had an interesting talk about making the wheels. We saw our bells with their new headstocks and our new clappers and the wheels which were being worked on.

School Assembly

6 November





A presentation was given to the children at the village school explaining how a bell works and what was being done with our village bells. Debbie made a 2 dimensional life size bell including stay, slider, runner board and clapper. Ann demonstrated what happens when you pull the rope and Stephen demonstrated what happened to the clapper.

Bells Return

#### November 12<sup>th</sup>



All was prepared and early on a chilly November morning the bells were returned. Before they were taken off the transport, Stephen, our vicar gave a short service to 'Welcome the bells'. It was just PERFECT including the reference to 'Save me O God' which is inscribed on our 5th bell. We welcomed over

30 visitors to see the bells before they were hoisted up into the belfry.

## Bell Installation

#### 11-28 November

Andrew Ogden (Oggy) was the Taylor's bellhanger who came down this time and he swiftly

organised our helpers to get all 6 bells and their components off the vehicle. Over the next 3 weeks some of our bellringers along with others from the Branch helped Oggy get our bells up and ringing. Other ringers and also volunteers from the church kept everyone fed and watered for the duration.

Gordon Paterson our Steeple Keeper positioned the last clapper to be put in, and Tower Captain Debbie Phipps attached the bolt at 10 past 12 on November 15th! All the bells were now hanging ready for all the fittings to be put in during the next couple of weeks. Ropes were attached and other fittings in the next few days followed by another big clean up. Hard hats were then put away ready for a final test ring.



## Test Ring

#### 28 November

We were grateful to have an experienced band of ringers to do a test ring and were thrilled with the way the bells now ring and sound; they are now said to be one of the best peals of 6 bells in the East Dorset Branch of the Salisbury Diocesan Guild and we believe the outcome is all that we had had planned for.



We are hugely grateful to Oggy for his expertise for carrying out the work with such professionalism and for supervising some of our own ringers to assist with the work (a once in a lifetime experience thoroughly enjoyed by all). We would also like to thank the support team who were always on hand to provide refreshments and lunches and taking on the other admin jobs necessary for a successful project. All in all a great team effort by ringers and non-ringers alike and an experience that brought a lot of people together.

## First Practice And Sunday Ring

He then transformed number IV headstock and preserved the old metal disc from the end to be used to hold the whiteboard. 3 more headstocks have been turned into beautiful items to be sold and the final headstock is being used by one of our bellringers in their garden.
