Fabric Update

You might well be forgiven for thinking that with the church closed everything to do with the building has come to a halt. ***You would be wrong!*** Slowly but surely we are creeping towards submitting an application to the Diocese for permission to ***replace all the old electrical circuits and lighting*** and add some security lights in the car park. This was started over a year ago but is almost there now.

We are also in the process of applying for permission to replace the ***wooden ladder in the belfry*** with a steel one with safety hoops. And also in the tower we are in the process of an application to add certain bits of electronics to enhance the simulator which is used when beginners start ringing.

The Diocese have introduced a new on line system which starts useful dialogue at the start of the process although as yet I haven't noticed any reduction in the amount of paperwork to be submitted!! ***Bill Carter***
